**Regular Meeting**

- I. The meeting was called to order at 7:05PM.
- II. **Attendees are as follows:**

- III. Minutes of the 2/6/2008 meeting were unanimously approved.
- IV. **Q & A for Residents:** None in attendance
- V. **Old Business**
  - A. **CTI Modeling:** CTI received the USGS and modeling files on 3/4/08. They used Summit County GIS mapping to find suggested sites for retention to check interaction with Indian Creek. The USGS looked at Indian Creek and the 2 major tributaries. CTI expects to have real info to discuss with the committee at the next meeting. It was also noted that Greg Bachman's budget passed, and he is willing to work with us on a regional retention project. CTI will write a letter directly to Greg B. thanking him for his interest and asking when he will be ready to review projects.
  - B. **EPA Phase 2 Follow-up:** Fred put in a follow-up request to be included in Summit County's general permit. Dave White told John Lund that Macedonia was included, but Fred will call Dave White to confirm. It was also briefly discussed that audits are done on a lottery basis. Macedonia has not been notified of any pending EPA audit.
  - C. **Letter for residents who participated in the survey:** Letters will go this week per Dennis. Should mail by Friday.
  - D. **Flooding at 8189 Valley View (from Bavaria Pkwy):** This is apparently an old existing creek. The front yard always flooded, so the resident decided to build a pond. A very large retention basin that serves many acres feeds the creek. The only possibility to reduce flooding would be if there is a retention possibility at a lower elevation, but this would be in Hudson.
  - E. **School's New Facilities:** The levy did not pass. The general consensus is that since it failed by such a small margin, it will be placed on the ballot again in August. The committee decided to

draft a letter to the BOE inviting them to be a part of the committee because of their direct and immediate connection to both retention and the creek. (Retention at Ledgeview Elementary, HS property has creek running through it)

**VI. New Business**

- A. Flooding at Iroquois & SHB 3/3/08:** A secondary pipe on the property is 18" above ground and 18" below ground. The underground pipe is collapsed or clogged. Water is still ponding at the pipe, and there are sinkholes in the yard. The plastic pipe enters the manhole. Jim says a letter must go out to them to have them fix the overflow. A letter was already mailed in February advising the resident he would have to address both the rear grate and the overflow pipe.
- B. Info from meeting Rob attended (names of local officials) for a round table discussion:** Still waiting on Dave White for this information.
- C. Possible impact of Summit Co. Engineer's budget:** The budget passed, we need to try to be first in line for funding for a regional retention project.
