THE CURRENT STATE OF OUR SAFETY SERVICES IS A CRITICAL ISSUE FOR THE CITY OF MACEDONIA.

Due to the failure of the May 2018 earned income tax, the City has resorted to borrowing from emergency accounts in a desperate effort to maintain state mandates, staffing requirements and our City's level of safety. This same earned income tax, consisting of a .25% increase, will appear on the Nov. 6 ballot in an attempt to resolve the losses we will suffer in our police, fire and service departments because of the earned income tax's previous failure.

Already, the City has had to reduce services on multiple fronts. If the .25% earned income tax fails again, the City will lose vital staff and resources and, ultimately, face unfortunate changes to our safety services.



1. Why can't we borrow money from the Rec Center?
2. We just passed an earned income tax levy in May of 2017 for roads. Why can't we use those funds?

We cannot use recreation funds or previous levy funds for other City operations. When funds are delegated, such as they were for the Rec Center and the earned income tax passed for roads, we are unable to mix or borrow from those specified pools of money. When money is delegated to one fund, there it must stay.
